#### **TRANSPORTATION** brainstormed list group 2:

- Insufficient multi-modal transportation support to match (connect) with ferry system. Options: taxi, train, bus, etc.
- Unsafe bicycle lanes
- Unsafe walking trail system
- Affordable and reliable senior transportation on island (especially from remote areas)
- Cost and schedules challenging for off-island visitors/clients
- Slow and inconsistent broadband (impacts remote workers)
- Ferry schedule is restrictive for commuters
- No community transport network
- Non-existent walking trail system
- Back-up system for phones and cell coverage lacking
- Tourist traffic needs to increase
- Eastsound village parking and walking flow is insufficient
- No good communication system to disoninate (?) trans options
- Scale of population insufficient to support a vital business community and transportation system
